#### What's My Job - Trustee Training

Information on how to be an outstanding library trustee

One of the most important - and most daunting - responsibilities of being a trustee is advocating for the library. If we all love the library, why is it sometimes so hard to encourage our neighbors to vote for the

organization that we love and support? Advocacy doesn't have to be scary. Its all a matter of being prepared and having impact information and stories to tell. Here's some tips for getting started:

- Look for ways to build library use. Get people in the door. People who are familiar with the library are more likely to support the library.
- Know some meaningful numbers. Be ready to say things like: "Did you know that more that half of all area residents are library users?"
- Tell stories. Nothing creates buy-in like hearing about the impact the library has had on members of the community.
- Be honest about money. Educated voters are more likely to be "yes" voters. Make your budget and finances public information.
- Be active. Make sure you and the library are participating in community issues and concerns.

NYLA Advocacy Day is one way to get education and experience on the advocacy role. Consider joining the MVLS contingent on March 1 in Albany. All are welcome, and all you have to do is show up and observe.

MVLS offers trustee training several times a year, and we are happy to work with individual library boards on trustee training. There are a variety of 45 minute sessions on topics from a basic overview to finances, legal issues and planning.
