### What's My Job - Trustee Training

Information on how to be an outstanding library trustee

Communications may not at first seem like a library trustee's job. Yet, communicating and interfacing with the community are central to the role of the library trustee. Trustees are the primary representatives of the library in the community, and they are the fiduciaries for the community concerning library matters. One way to understand the communications element of trustee duties is illustrated through the New York State Public Library Minimum Standards.

Here are a few that have a communications flavor:

- Minimum Standard #3 requires every library to provide a written annual report to the community on library services and activities.
- Minimum Standard #5 requires every library to approve a written budget and to present that budget to appropriate funding authorities.
- Minimum Standard #6 requires every library to provide printed information on the library's rules, hours, services, etc.

In addition, several other minimum standards provide opportunities for communicating with the public. For example, your library's bylaws (MS #1), long range plan of service (MS #2), and policies (MS #4) are all public documents designed in part to inform the community on library activities. The library's evaluation efforts (MS #6) also provide an opportunity for community engagement.

Are there other ways that your library can improve your interaction with your community?

MVLS offers trustee training several times a year, and we are happy to work with individual library boards on trustee training. There are a variety of 45-minute sessions on topics from a basic overview of the role of the trustee, as well as finances, legal issues, and planning. #### **Policy Update**

Help in keeping your policies current

For the past several months, we have been reviewing financial and associated administrative policies. In the fall, we will move on to library use policies. In this issue, we have one more administrative policy to address: public relations policy. Public relations policies answer a few basic questions. Who is the official spokesperson for the library? (In most cases it will be the director.) What formats are they expected to use to disseminate information? What are your library's goals for public relations?

Communications plans are more detailed guidelines and procedures for accomplishing public relations goals. Communications Specialist Wade Abbott is currently developing a communications plan for MVLS, and he is available to help individual libraries develop their own communications plans.
